Research activities

Participation involves 4 evaluation sessions consisting of a survey and a driving simulator activity. Learners and parents will also be invited to record the forward roadway and in car instruction during a one-week period when they have approximately 25 hours in their logbook.

Covering the costs

The research team is offering \$50 each time learners and parents complete the first three evaluation sessions and \$155.05 to cover the cost of the learner licence for participants who complete all research activities.

Participant safety

As participants will be required to partake in a driving simulator activity, those who suffer from motion sickness or epilepsy should not participate.

Length of the study

This study will take place over a minimum of 18 months and possibly up to 3 years.

Evaluation sessions are estimated to take 2 hours.
